often rolled out under localized urban rejuvenation and clean-city frameworks is a targeted sanitation drive designed to completely eliminate open defecation and urination in urban clusters.

Project Scope

The physical distribution of the infrastructure is strategically calculated to manage high-footfall public commercial zones and low-income residential pockets:

Identified Locations: 57 distinct sites spread across the Buxar Nagar Parishad area.

Toilet Seats: 308 high-utility seats divided symmetrically into separate male, female, and divyangjan (differently-abled) accessible enclosures.

Urinal Units: 150 standalone wall-mounted urinals optimized with water-saving flush valves to mitigate public urination along city walls and transit hubs.

To prevent these blocks from falling into disrepair, a common issue with older public facilities this project is engineered to align directly with Buxar's broader ongoing waste management pipelines. MLA Anand Mishra aggressively champions this public sanitation framework during DISHA and municipal monitoring reviews.
